The Employability Curriculum Unit (Provides programme teams with high level consultancy to collaboratively plan, design and deliver curricular and co-curricular employability interventions);

The Employability Business Services Unit (Works with local, national & international employers to develop, secure and promote student and graduate internships, professional placements, work experience and employment opportunities);

The Employability Services Unit. (Provides a careers information and guidance service to all students and graduates and is supported by a fifteen strong student engagement team).

Priorities of Employability and Careers Directorate

- To lead, support or otherwise contribute to the realisation of objectives in the Employability Strategy
- To lead and support relevant internal and external working groups/committees
- To facilitate meaningful partnerships with and between employers, faculties and departments;
- To lead and support with the systems and data needed to inform and embed employability within and outside the curriculum
- To provide a focus for engagement with research and practice in employability;
- To work in partnership with CHERP in the development and delivery of the MED, revalidation and validation of programmes;
- To keep in touch with external developments in employability practice (including AGCAS, AHECS and Advanced HE), drawing on, contributing to and disseminating best practice.
